This factory (the only one in ET), has invested Rp. 1,395,671,000 (the largest industrial investment in ET so far), employs 42 workers, produces 465 tons of sandalwood oil and waste worth Rp 497,088,000 in 1990. The oil is exported to France, while the waste is exported to Taiwan. The company's oil presses can consume 30 to 40 tons of sandalwood per month, but the Forestry Service can only supply it with less than 20 tons per month, through depots in every sandalwood producing district in ET, where the company buys the wood for Rp 4,000 to 8,000 per kg, depending on the quality of the wood.</p> <p>Three years ago, the company provided 30,000 sandalwood seedlings to the prov. govt., but the company claims that it takes 30 years before the wood can be harvested. However, according to a researcher who hails from West Timor, so far no sandalwood reforestation project has succeeded. BIG's unsuccessful sugar project in Lautem

The idea to build sugar mills in Lautem (Lospalos) by utilizing the savannahs of Lautem and Baucau for sugar plantations, came mainly from Harry Murdani, a brother of Gen. Benny Murdani. As project officer Harry Murdani hired a

retired military, Soewantho, former army commander (Dandim) of Sust. Soewantho's house in Dili was used as the project's *base camp*. But for unclear reasons (lack of water? security problems?), the sugar project did not go through. Soewantho is now the head of the ET branch of Apindo (Asosiasi Pengusaha Indonesia). His address is Jl. Akadiruhun, Phone: (0390) 21-843. To export the sugar, a new harbor (port) was going to be built at Com, a fishers' village in Lautem. It is unclear which BIG member was going to construct the harbor. According to one source, the "sugar project" became a point of rivalry between Murdani's and Tutut Suharto's companies in ET. According to another source, the harbor was going to be built by PT Spektra, and PT Konindo Timor was only going to be involved in the project's supervision. According to another source again, the sugar project was related to the PT Guntur Madu Tama Group, which is owned by the Sumampouw brothers. All these "infos" still need to be verified.

#### BIG-related casino on Christmas Island

Christmas Island Resort Pty. Ltd.: this casino is a joint-venture between Robby Sumampouw (63% shares), Lauw & Sons Pte. Ltd. of Singapore (27%), and the Perth-based Frand Woodmore of Casino Australia International (10%). The casino and its hotel has been opened by Australia's Minister for Tourism on December 18, 1993. It was projected that the casino will attract 20 flights, bringing in about 1,000 persons, every weekend. The hotel will employ 360 employees, mostly (mainland) Australians, who will eventually be replaced by locals. The 45 minutes flight from Jakarta is served by Mandala and Sempati Airlines. Sempati flies 5 times a week from Jakarta to the Indian Ocean tourist resort, where a 2-days package tour for Rp 950,000 has been promoted in *Kompas* by the resort's rep. office in Jakarta (phone no: (021) 381-0265 till 381-0275).

This company is claimed to explore for gold on the island of Atauro, a claim which still need to be verified. It does mine gold on the nearby island of Wetar in SE Maluku. This company is 90% owned by Billiton, the mineral arms of the Anglo-Dutch oil giant Royal Dutch/Shell, which has created various adverse socio-ecological effects on Wetar (see Marr, 1993: 62-64).

PT Anak Liambau: According to Taylor (1991: 127), this company is owned by Soeharto's son-in-law, Prabowo. This constructing company has carried out several civil engineering projects in ET, e.g. the 9 Km road between Maliana & Bobonaro for Rp 920 million, which began in April 1993 and has not yet been finished at the end of February 1994, while the upgraded parts of the road has already began to tear down here and there. It also built two check dams on Maloa river in West Dili subdistrict for Rp 333 million, which was planned to be finished at the end of January 1994.
